Guilty Plea for Attempted Unlawful Surveillance



ALBANY, NY – District Attorney P. David Soares announced today that ADAM EGAN, 35, of Bethlehem, pleaded guilty to (1) Count of Attempted Unlawful Surveillance in the Second Degree, a Class A Misdemeanor, before the Honorable Judge Norman C. Massry in Colonie Town Court this evening.

On December 23, 2015, at approximately 3:40 p.m., EGAN did unlawfully attempt to take a video recording of an individual in the changing room of a Salvation Army store in the area of Troy-Schenectady Road and Aragon Avenue in the Town of Colonie. EGAN left the scene of the incident and attempted to delete the video recording after a witness observed him using the video recording equipment. Colonie Town Police officers arrested EGAN nearby the scene of the incident, following a 911 complaint.

EGAN faces 3 years under the supervision of the Department of Probation, and will be mandated to follow Sex Offender Conditions during that time. EGAN is scheduled to be sentenced on July 25, 2016 in Colonie Town Court.
