Resolutions for Multiple Vehicular Crime Cases

ALBANY, NY – District Attorney P. David Soares announced today the resolutions of several vehicular crime cases in Albany County Court.

TYRONE TABANNA, 31, of Albany, was sentenced to 1-3 years in State Prison, before the Honorable Peter A. Lynch in Albany County Court.

On August 8, 2017, TABANNA pleaded guilty to (1) Count of Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Motor Vehicle in the 1st Degree, a Class E Felony. On March 27, 2017, at approximately 1:30 AM, in the City of Albany, TABANNA did operate a vehicle while knowing that his license was revoked. A traffic stop was initiated due to TABANNA's failure to signal. Upon being asked to show his driver's license, he fled in his vehicle, crashed into a house, and escaped on foot. TABANNA was arrested and charged a few days later.

Assistant District Attorney Michael Shanley of the Vehicular Crimes Unit prosecuted this case.

Also, **DONALD ERRICHETTO**, 39, of New Rochelle, NY, pleaded guilty to (1) Count of Criminal Possession of Stolen Property in the Third Degree, a Class D Felony, and (1) Count of Driving While Intoxicated, an unclassified misdemeanor, before the Honorable Thomas A. Breslin in Albany County Supreme Court. On August 5, 2017, at approximately 8:00 A.M., ERRICHETTO did steal and operate a Mazzone catering truck from the Glen Sanders Mansion in Schenectady County. Officers attempted to pull him over due to a flat tire and ERRICHETTO led them on a vehicle pursuit, ultimately ending with him fleeing on foot. Officers noticed an odor of alcohol. ERRICHETTO refused sobriety tests, was apprehended and charged.

ERRICHETTO faces 2-4 years in State Prison and license revocation when sentenced on November 29, 2017 and upon release will also have to install and maintain an Ignition Interlock Device.

Assistant District Attorney Michael Shanley of the Vehicular Crimes Unit prosecuted this case.

Additionally, **SARINA JORDAN**, 32, of Mechanicville, NY, pleaded guilty to Violation of Probation, before the Honorable Thomas A. Breslin in Albany County Supreme Court.

On February 7, 2017, JORDAN pleaded guilty to (1) Count of Driving While Intoxicated, a Class E Felony, and was remanded into custody. On May 9, 2017, she was sentenced to six months jail and 5 years of probation. Prior to starting probation, JORDAN served four months of incarceration in Albany County Correctional Facility. Upon her release, she moved with a person who was known to her to Saratoga County. On August 20, 2017, JORDAN was arrested by the Saratoga County Sheriff's Department for Aggravated Unlicensed Operation of a Vehicle, a Class A Misdemeanor, and Interlock Violation, a Class A Misdemeanor. The arrest violated the terms and conditions of her probation.

JORDAN faces up to 1-3 years in State Prison when sentenced on November 30, 2017.

Vehicular Crime Bureau Chief Mary Tanner-Richter prosecuted this case.

Furthermore, **TYRONE JORDAN**, 47, of Albany, pleaded guilty to (1) Count of Aggravated Driving While Intoxicated; Child in Vehicle, a Class E Felony, before the Honorable Thomas A. Breslin in Albany County Supreme Court. On September 6, 2017, Officers did stop JORDAN for a traffic violation. Upon speaking with him, Officers observed JORDAN to have bloodshot/watery eyes, slurred speech, and an odor of alcohol emanating from his breath. JORDAN submitted to field sobriety tests and failed, with a blood alcohol content of .14%.

JORDAN did have his two children, both under the age of 16, in his vehicle, and while not having a valid NYS license.

JORDAN faces up to 4 months in Albany County Jail, to be followed by 5 years of Probation, when sentenced on November 30, 2017 and one year License Revocation subject to DMV determinations, \$1000 fine, and will have to install and maintain an Ignition Interlock Device upon his release from custody.

Vehicular Crime Bureau Chief Mary Tanner-Richter prosecuted this case.

Finally, **ANTHONY NICHOLS**, 57, of Albany, was sentenced to 30 days in Albany County Jail, to be followed by 5 years of Probation, before the Honorable Thomas A. Breslin in Albany County Supreme Court.

On August 7, 2017, NICHOLS pleaded guilty to (1) Count of Driving While Intoxicated, a Class E Felony. On May 24, 2017, around 12:50 AM, NICHOLS did drive a vehicle over the shoulder and onto the grass near Strawberry Lane. At the time of the traffic stop, NICHOLS had physical signs of intoxication and did admit to having too many drinks at Maggie's, an Albany sports bar and grill. NICHOLS failed field sobriety tests and had a blood alcohol content level of .16 approximately one hour after the stop.

Vehicular Crime Bureau Chief Mary Tanner-Richter prosecuted this case.
