Resolutions in Two Thruway Vehicular Crimes Cases

ALBANY, NY- District Attorney P. David Soares announced today that two Vehicular Crimes Unit felony cases went before the Court in Albany County today.

JENNIFER BRADSHAW, 30, of Schenectady, was sentenced to 60 Days of Community Service and 5 Years of Felony Probation, before the Honorable Judge Peter A. Lynch in Albany County Court this morning.

On May 3, 2016, BRADSHAW pleaded guilty to an entire indictment consisting of (1) Count of Driving While Intoxicated Per Se, (1) Count of Driving While Intoxicated, both Class E Felonies, and (1) Count of Reckless Driving, a Misdemeanor.

On November 26, 2015, at approximately 12:50am, BRADSHAW was stopped by the New York

State Police for unsafely backing out of an EZ-Pass lane on I-90 in the Town of Guilderland. As a result of that stop, BRADSHAW was found to be operating her vehicle while intoxicated. BRADSHAW failed Field Sobriety Tests and registered a 0.17% Blood Alcohol Content. BRADSHAW has a prior DWI conviction within the past 10 years.

BRADSHAW was also sentenced 5 years of an Ignition Interlock Device, and a minimum of 1 year of license revocation, subject to the Department of Motor Vehicles.

At the time of sentencing the People requested 30 days in the Albany County Correctional Facility to be served on weekends, 5 years Felony Probation with Drug Court conditions, and a \$1,000.00 fine.

Additionally, CONNOR CARROLL, 23, of Orleans, Massachusetts, pleaded guilty to (1) Count of Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the Fifth Degree, a Class D Felony, and (1) Count of Driving While Ability Impaired by Drugs, a Class E Felony, before the Honorable Stephen W. Herrick in Albany County Court this morning.

On May 8, 2016, New York State Police made a welfare check on a vehicle stopped on the shoulder of the New York State Thruway in the Town of Coeymans. Upon approaching the vehicle, the troopers observed CARROLL to be in possession of a small quantity of heroin, assorted pills, and 3 grams of cocaine. CARROLL displayed physical signs of impairment, and a blood test later concluded that he was operating the vehicle while impaired by drugs.

CARROLL faces 6 months in the Albany County Correctional Facility, 5 years of Felony Probation, a \$1,000.00 fine, and a minimum 1 year license revocation, subject to the Department of Motor Vehicles when he is sentenced on August, 29, 2016.

Vehicular Crimes Unit Bureau Chief Mary Tanner-Richter is handling the prosecution of these cases
