**Drunk Driving + Open Container + Driving
Wrong Way Down a One Way + No Headlights +
Suspended License + Repeat DWI Convictions =
State Prison**



ALBANY, NY- District Attorney P. David Soares announced today that DYLAN REMINGTON, 29, of Nassau, was sentenced to 1 1/3 to 4 years in State Prison before the Honorable Peter A.

Lynch in Albany County Supreme Court yesterday morning.

On July 17, 2014, REMINGTON pleaded guilty to (1) Count of Driving While Intoxicated, a Class D Felony.

On May 26, 2014, at about 10:30pm, REMINGTON was driving a black 2006 Ford with no headlights, going the wrong way down State Street in the City of Albany, which is a one way street, while intoxicated. When officers activated sirens REMINGTON did throw a 25 ounce can of "Natty Daddy" brand beer out of the window. Officers observed that REMINGTON had the odor of alcoholic beverage coming from his breath, glassy and bloodshot eyes, impaired motor coordination, and unsteadiness on his feet. REMINGTON refused to submit a breath test or chemical analysis of his blood to determine his level of intoxication. REMINGTON was driving with a suspended license stemming from a previous DWI incident and has two previous DWI convictions.

In addition to his State Prison sentence, REMINGTON must also pay court \$2000 in fines and surcharges, be subject to a driver's license revocation for a minimum of 18 months subject to Department of Motor Vehicles guidelines, be subject to Ignition Interlock restriction for 5 years, and attend a Victim Impact Panel.

Assistant District Attorney Melinda Seiden-Fiorino of the Vehicular Crimes Unit prosecuted this case.
