## **Jury Finds Persistent Felon Guilty of Multiple Home Burglaries in Albany County**



**ALBANY, NY** – District Attorney P. David Soares announced today that PAUL HARRIS, 67, of Albany, was found guilty after a jury trial of (4) Counts of Burglary in the Second Degree, each Class C Violent Felonies, before the Honorable Roger D. McDonough in Albany County Supreme Court yesterday afternoon.

After hearing witness testimony and reviewing the evidence presented at trial, the jury found that on four separate dates HARRIS did knowingly and unlawfully enter four separate dwellings in

the County of Albany, with the intent to commit the crime of burglary. From December 21, 2017 to January 12, 2018, during day-time hours, HARRIS stole jewelry, currency, and other property from four separate homes in the Village of Altamont, Town of Colonie, and Town of Guilderland. An executed search warrant uncovered the stolen property at his apartment in the City of Albany.

In February of 2017, HARRIS was released from State Prison after serving a 20 year sentence for a burglary conviction. HARRIS was under the supervision of Parole at the time the above stated incidents occurred.

Since 1977, HARRIS has had 10 felony convictions, two of which were deemed violent burglary convictions.

If deemed a mandatory persistent violent felon at sentencing, Harris faces 100 years to Life in State Prison when sentenced on May 10, 2019.

Assistant District Attorneys Joseph Brucato and Emily Schultz are handling the prosecution of this case.
